

WHO CAN USE PASCH-NET?



PASCH-net services such as reading texts with varying levels of language difficulty, teaching materials and information on pedagogical methods are available to all teachers, wherever they are in the world.

The services in the restricted areas of the website – the communities and the PASCH learning platform – are available to PASCH schools and their partner schools in Germany. Other schools can use PASCH-net if they are involved in projects with PASCH schools. Anyone who wants to play an active role in the communities or the PASCH learning platform on PASCH-net has to register and then log in with his/her email address and password.

The PASCH initiative is a global network of some 1800 schools which recognize the importance of German.

PASCH is an initiative of the Federal Foreign Office in cooperation with the Central Agency for Schools Abroad (ZfA), the Goethe-Institut (GI), the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the Educational Exchange Service of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Länder in the Federal Republic of Germany (PAD).

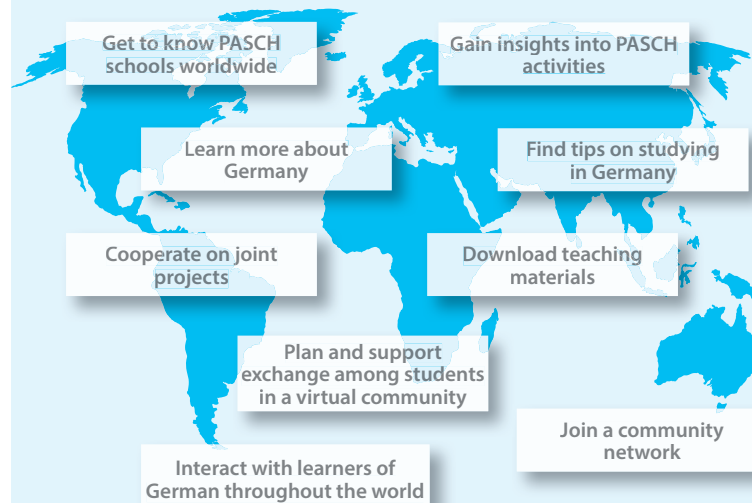
The aim of the PASCH initiative is to spark an interest in Germany, German society and the German language among young people from other countries. Its goal is to provide students and teachers with lasting qualifications and to form a long-term international learning community. The initiative promotes exchange between the PASCH schools abroad as well as between these schools and schools in Germany.

PASCH-Net: The General Area

The general area features information on the institutions involved and their activities. This includes news from the PASCH world, projects in the context of the PASCH initiative and blogs from different parts of the world. An interactive world map provides an overview of the PASCH schools network. The participating schools introduce themselves with brief portraits. The virtual partner school marketplace partnerschulnetz.de helps schools abroad and in Germany to find suitable candidates for school partnerships. Student teachers in Germany can find information about work experience at PASCH schools.



PASCH-Net: The Teachers' Area

This area includes ideas for using PASCH-net in German lessons, teaching materials for download and information on pedagogical methods. In the community and via blogs teachers from all over the world can interact with one another, do (transnational) projects and get their classes involved in online school newspapers. The moodle-based PASCH learning platform gives teachers of German the opportunity to set up virtual classrooms for lessons or learn more about using digital media in lessons via tutor-assisted online training courses.

PASCH-Net: The Students' Area

Learners of German from PASCH schools can share ideas in the community, set up groups and upload texts, photos and videos. Competitions and projects encourage students to get involved. Regular discussion forums, activities and learning games invite learners to practise their German. Texts with different levels of difficulty provide information about Germany, including options for studying there.
